

Problem Statement in Project Area



In our operational region, a deeply entrenched patriarchal culture profoundly impacts girls and young women's access to education. Regrettably, girls are often perceived as burdens within their families, leading to a lower prioritization of investments in their education, especially during periods of resource constraints. Consequently, they frequently find themselves in the most deprived segment of the family structure, where their essential needs remain unmet.

Across many villages in Western Uttar Pradesh, girls aged 14 and older are denied the opportunity to attend school due to enduring rural gender stereotypes. These stereotypes perpetuate the belief that once married into other households, girls cease to contribute to their natal families, rendering investments in their education futile. Unfortunately, this not only creates barriers to enrollment but also hinders their ability to achieve expected learning standards, as highlighted by the Annual Status of Education Report (ASER).


Furthermore, it's crucial to acknowledge the alarming surge in crimes against women in the Uttar Pradesh region, ranking it among the highest in India according to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB). These gender-based offenses are, in part, a direct consequence of the lack of education and awareness in the area.

The Pardada Pardadi Educational Society (PPES) began its mission in 2000, under the visionary leadership of Virendra 'Sam' Singh, retired President and Managing Director of DuPont South Asia. He founded the society with the unwavering belief that only holistic education can drive the societal change necessary to counter these challenges. Our educational program is designed to confront these pressing issues, ensuring that the girls and women of Anupshahar not only receive an education but also become financially independent and socially empowered individuals who can advocate for their rights and needs.



EDUCATION



The education program is to empower girls socially and economically. The main focus of the program is to encourage each girl to become an independent thinker and self-learner.



Academic Results- Academic session- 2021-22

Our girls have graduated from the UP-state board exams with flying colours. This year, 64 students appeared for the 12th standard exams, with **98.44**% of them scoring in the first division.

The highest percentage achieved was **80.6%.** In the 10th standard, 105 students appeared for the exams, with more than 95% of them scoring in the first division.

Mobile IT Bus

We are committed to ensuring that the education of our girls remains relevant to present times, covering the latest subjects, curriculums, skill-building, and training. One of our most significant initiatives in this regard has been in the field of IT education. Thanks to the Jubilant Bhartia Foundation, we have elevated this endeavor to the next level with the introduction of a smart bus generously provided by the organization.

This state-of-the-art infrastructure is fully selfsustaining and serves as a mobile IT lab equipped with advanced workstations, along with an HP-enabled curriculum.

- A total of 594 girls from 3rd to 5th grade girls have directly benefited.
- The introduction of digital resources has significantly enhanced the classroom learning experience, inspiring a genuine interest among students to attend classes and actively participate in their education.



The positive impact of this initiative is already being felt among our students and teachers, infusing greater excitement into the learning and growth process.



Career Counselling Sessions

Career counseling plays a vital role in empowering individuals to make informed career decisions, pursue meaningful opportunities, and navigate the dynamic landscape of today's workforce effectively.

Recently, in collaboration with IDC (I Dream Career) and EYF (Ernst and Young Foundation), we organized career counseling sessions for 9th and 11th grade girls, engaging over 340 students in discussions about higher education options, subject choices, and college preparation exams. The primary focus was to raise awareness among girls about the multitude of possibilities and opportunities for a brighter future.




We have also introduced a specially designed program in partnership with IDC called the **Disha Mentoring Program**. Through this program, students work with the IDC team to achieve various milestones, participate in leadership coaching and mentoring, and acquire essential life skills crucial for their overall development.

Hands-on-Learning through STEM Labs

To provide futuristic exposure to our students, PPES has been promoting STEM education. In 2020, a STEM lab was set up which caters to around 500 girls. Today, about 132 girls, out of 158 total PPES working girls, are working with the top IT and automobile companies like Cisco, Schneider, HCL, Wipro, Tata Motors, Tata Electronics, etc.

The objective of STEM Lab is to facilitate the blending of traditional learning with **hands-on experience** and **real-world application** which is vital for developing an innovative mind. PPES is committed to generating students' interest in STEM, developing their aspirations, and providing them with necessary exposure through various interventions. This will help in nurturing girls creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving skills.

In collaboration with EY, PPES had introduced STEM app to introduce various courses through the app.The self-learning app is designed to provide hands-on knowledge in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The EY STEM App is an innovative gamified learning application aimed at inspiring and empowering the next generation of female leaders in STEM fields and promoting a more equal future. This application is used by 6th to 8th-grade girls, and it has already attracted 480 registered users who are taking various courses through the app.





Learning through STEM Lab

Choices and aspirations cannot be divided based on gender. I aspire to have a career in robotics and become the first girl in the field from my community, as these are not popular fields for girls here. Along with my classmates, we developed a laser home security system.

Determined and resilient in the face of the patriarchal community she was born into, Priya managed to convince her parents to let her continue her education and pursue her dream of a different future for herself. She eventually pursued a B. Tech course at Banasthali Vidyapith in Rajasthan.

Priya's journey was not without challenges. She faced numerous hurdles, but her perseverance and dedication paid off. Even before completing her course, she was offered a job by a leading global conglomerate, stepping straight into the well-paid employment that she loves. Her story is a testament to the power of education and serves as an inspiration to others at the school. 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Health and Hygiene



PRANA Health Centre

According to Indian Ayurveda, PRANA is a Sanskrit word that signifies breath, life force, or vital principle. It is considered the foundation and essence of all life, representing the energy and vitality that permeates the entire universe.

Due to the lack of quality healthcare and the increasing demand for it, PPES established the Prana Health Center in 2016. This new clinic facilitated the expansion of the health program, offering quality medical care not only to students and staff but also to the villagers of Anupshahr. Prana Health Center is a bright and clean space, equipped with a nurse's and doctor's office, examination rooms, a pharmacy, and facilities for health education classes.



Vaccinations administered by PRANA Health Centre

- 6710+ patients were treated this year including school girls, SHG women, and community members
- · Hemoglobin tests were done for 305 girls
- . 605 HPV vaccination doses done for students
- . 1417 Hepatitis B vaccination doses were provided to students
- . 126 doses of Tetanus were provided
- . 97+ Education classes were provided to students in the year

Health and Hygiene





Initiatives taken during the year towards Health and Hygiene

- Physical health check-up camps were organized during quarter one for our students to have their BP and BMI checked.
- Hemoglobin tests were done for mostly those who suffered from ailments and were visibly deficient. This is followed by providing them with proper treatment and diet.
- Health education classes were conducted on topics including oral hygiene and the importance of nutritional food.
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Workshops were conducted on how to save a person's life if their breathing or heartbeat stops.
- Menstrual hygiene sessions were conducted regularly throughout the year.
- Cervical cancer vaccination was given to 163 girls in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION (CDD)

Community Development Division

While educating the girls in our school, we recognized the importance of working alongside their mothers and aunts to ensure continuous support for the girls' education and to empower women.

To achieve this goal, PPES has been actively involved in forming and strengthening Self-Help Groups (SHGs). We facilitate inter-loaning among the groups, promote financial inclusion within the banking system to meet the credit needs of SHG members, support the creation of micro-enterprises and entrepreneurs, conduct livelihood generation and income enhancement activities, provide training in farming and animal rearing practices, offer health and hygiene training, and collaborate with central and state-sponsored government schemes and programs.

Currently, our program engages with 10,400 women in partnership with the NRLM (National Rural Livelihood Mission) under the Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission.



Launch of Project 'UTTHAN' - Supported by EY Foundation



Launch of 3-year project 'Utthan' in partnership with EY Foundation . This project aims to provide livelihood interventions and income enhancement to around 11,000 rural women & and their families.

Under the project:

- We undertook capacity building for SHGs, which includes developing a Micro Credit plan for SHG members to plan their financials and livelihood activities effectively.
- We conducted leadership development capacity-building training for 381 Self-Help Group (SHG) officebearers (OBs). The training focused on enhancing their skills in running SHGs effectively and managing group dynamics.
- Four village organizations were established and inaugurated, along with the formation and inauguration of one Cluster Level Federation. Additionally, efforts are underway to link families of PPES girls with government health insurance and pension schemes.
- The Community health cadre, known as 'Swasthya Sakhi,' operates in 30 villages to raise awareness about preventive medicines and vaccinations.
- We organized exposure visits to several locations, including the Noida Solar Charkha Unit, Ghaziabad's Hetha Organic Dairy Farm for phenyl making, and SEWA Ahmedabad. These visits aimed to provide more insight into employment opportunities for Self-Help Group (SHG) women and to learn about the development of microenterprises, marketing strategies, and sustainability of community institutions.



Initiatives by Community Development Division

- Developed a Production unit to manufacture chemical-free floor cleaners to provide livelihood opportunities to the local community.
- Under the community development division, 25 new micro-enterprises were established. This
 initiative aims to increase income levels and create new livelihood opportunities for women. Training
 in Micro Credit Livelihood Plan (MCLP) was provided to help them plan their livelihood activities
 effectively.
- We conducted an exposure visit with the director of the Silk Board in Meerut to explore the income generation potential of sericulture for our Self-Help Group (SHG) farmers. Additionally, we facilitated the setup of a Solar Charkha unit, leading to 25 women gaining employment from the unit





Community Development

SUCCESS STORY- Community Development

Rukmani came from a struggling family, facing constant challenges to make ends meet. However, when she joined the Self-Help Group (SHG), a ray of hope illuminated her family's hardships, although difficult conditions persisted.

Together with nine other SHG members, Rukmani embarked on a mission to uplift their lives and boost their daily earnings. After six months of relentless dedication, she began exploring ways to increase her family's income with support from the SHG.

During this time, Rukmani was offered the role of a Bank Sakhi. In this capacity, she not only managed her SHGs banking needs but also assisted other SHG members in transactions such as deposits and withdrawals. She also ensured that SHG members were well-informed about various financial schemes like CCL (Cash Credit Limit), PMBY (Pradhan Mantri Bima Yojana), PMSBY (Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana), and other banking services.

Rukmani's expertise became invaluable to many women in the community. Despite facing challenges when her role was withdrawn due to structural changes, Rukmani and her husband remained undaunted. They decided to start а small confectionery shop, which eventually thrived. Their success inspired other SHG women to establish their micro-enterprises, paving the way for financial independence and empowerment within the community.
